The Meeting proceeded as follow:

1. The status on Weboc Empty Module extension and CRF was discussed, whereby it was deliberated that the problems are still arising and there is an impression that the shipping lines are not interested in the Weboc system. Corporate Secretary is advised to draft a reminder letter before 31st March 2022.
2. Mr. Salahuddin briefed on the meeting with SBP, that the work is still in process and the transactions regarding the Electronic Bill of Lading and will take approximately 2 months to get completed. Furthermore, everyone has to be on board with the idea of EBL working in a similar manner like that of foreign exchange.
3. It was also briefed that Pakistan Single Window is a part of Port Community System which will later be integrated with it. Report pertaining to PSW has been agreed with

and the Malaysian port has selected for PCS, and therefore, it is suggested that the stakeholders practically study and amend the report accordingly.

4. The process of freight remittance has commenced and discussions have to be made whether the manual documents are easier or electronic ways should also be incorporated.
5. General Secretary mentioned that there has been a delay in data providing and therefore since the Customs House has opened now, four terminals are functioning and the work has commenced. A meeting will soon take place with the Chief Collector for the enhancement in work.
6. Mr. Misbah from QICT briefed on the stuck-up containers of shipping lines at the terminals and that Customs will support and it is their suggestion that the Shipping Lines must come forward and assist in the release of containers. As there are a total of 1200 stuck-up containers, a meeting will be held next week to help resolve this problem.
7. Corporate Secretary notified about the completion of the SECP compliance by coming and that an acknowledgment will be shared with the Members.
8. Ministry of Commission drafted a letter for Japan & Pakistan Joint Business Dialogue which will be circulated and if there are no further comments by the members, then a letter is to be drafted as a response respectively.
9. Agenda regarding proposal request of FPCCI in Transit Trade procedure, Index type for Uzbekistan Transit Trade and letter from DG Transit Trade to APSA as agendas were both clubbed and stated that they will also be circulated and a letter on the feedback will be drafted and if there are no comments, then APSA will move forward with it.
10. With the permission of the Chair, it was enquired regarding the Election updates of FPCCI and was responded, stating that it has been withheld for now and a team has been assigned on temporary basis who has taken interim charge for management of Federal Affairs till an official team has been appointed.

The Meeting ended up with a vote of thanks and appreciation to and from the Chair.
